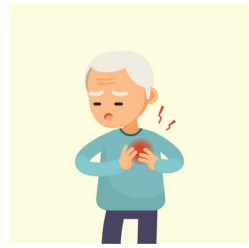

## NATIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL ALERT MONTH

A medical alert system can summon assistance in the event of a fall or other medical emergency, offering reassurance not only to the person using it, but to family members as well. At some point in our lives we may consider a medical alert system for our own safety or the safety of a loved one. When, or if, that time comes here are a few things to consider.

### Home-based or Mobile System?

- ♦♦ Home-based systems are designed to work inside your home using a telephone landline.
- ♦♦ Many companies now offer home-based systems that work over a cellular network for those with no landline.
- ♦♦ Home-based systems utilizing a landline only work when the user is at home. Those with mobile capabilities can be used when away from home as well.



### Monitored or not?

- ♦♦ Monitored systems have a wearable button that when pressed, connects the user to a dispatcher. There is usually a monthly fee for this service
- ♦♦ Non-monitored systems call a friend or family member and can be programmed to call multiple persons before calling 911 if someone can't be reached. No fee for this service

### Fall detection feature?

- ♦♦ If a fall is detected, systems with this feature will call dispatch. This technology is not perfected and may register a fall when none has occurred. There is a fee for this service.
